"You can well imagine how that fired my imagination. I became as anxious for the coming of the Messiah as my father. Often I would wonder if the Messiah would come in my day. With my

father I prayed earnestly that GOD would send the great Deliverer soon.

"GOD answered our prayers. I was nearing the age of thirty when I began to hear of a man by the name of JESUS. At the time I heard about Him He was teaching in Galilee. I heard that He taught in the synagogues and proclaimed the good news of the Kingdom. He had power to heal the sick. People told me that He healed every disease, even that of leprosy. Hundreds followed whithersoever he went.

"I determined to find Him and traveled to Galilee. I first saw Him as He was teaching a great multitude. There must have been at least two thousand people. His teaching was simple and with authority. "It was a proud day for me to be chosen by JESUS to be one of the Twelve. We were especially chosen to be His witnesses and He took special pains to teach us the truths of the Kingdom. It was after He had chosen the Twelve that He delivered the sermon from the mount. It was thrilling to learn that we were to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world. JESUS told us, too, that we would even be blessed if we were persecuted for His sake. When JESUS finished His teachings 'the people were astonished at His doctrine: for He taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes.'
